

Module 4 Learning Objectives and Discussion Questions

THE COMPLEXITIES OF SEX TRAFFICKING

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Familiarize students with the realities and manifestations of sex trafficking, including sex tourism, internet-based exploitation, certain traditional practices, child and forced marriages, and others.
2. Understand the vulnerabilities of sex trafficking victims and methods used to lure and trap people in sex trafficking.
3. Explore some effective approaches to address sex trafficking.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What are the vulnerabilities that lead to people being sex trafficked?
2. What are ways that these vulnerabilities can be addressed to prevent people from being exploited in this way?
3. Which form of sex trafficking do you think is the most prevalent in your community/your country and why?
4. What kinds of practices meet the definition of sex trafficking? Candidates to explore include child marriage, forced marriage, certain traditional practices (temple marriages, for example), child soldiers exploited as sex slaves, internet-based exploitation, and others.
5. What are the different approaches to ending sex trafficking?
